### LAPD Community-Police Advisory Board Highlights:

- 1. Since March 15, there have been no fatalities in West Traffic Wilshire. Half of recent traffic citations in West Bureau (contains 5 divisions) were in Wilshire (where we reside). There has been a 10% reduction in overall collisions since April.
- During summer, there is normally an increase in motor vehicle v. pedestrian collisions, which may be
  attributed to children playing outdoors and in the street; however, in Wilshire these collisions have gone down
  recently. Get the word out to drivers to watch for kids in residential areas.
- 3. Robberies, aggravated assaults, burglaries and burglary from motor vehicles are all up; violent crimes are spread evenly throughout the Division. Property crimes are higher at the northern end of the Division.
- 4. Wilshire added net 6 additional officers, allowing for a couple more cars to patrol the area.
- 5. Field Roll Calls have been increased to 5-6 times per week. Community members are invited to contact their Senior Lead Officer to request Roll Call in their area.
- 6. Tammy Rosato and Kari Garcia will begin to roll out Neighborhood Watch trainings at C-PAB. The LAPD website on Neighborhood Watch is being updated based on their efforts. Block-by-block organization empowers citizens to secure property, utilize private patrol, and actively participate in neighborhood watch.
